I. Background:

United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) is partnering with Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) for undertaking life skills based sexual and reproductive health (SRH) education since 2009. In KISS, around 25,000 tribal students are pursuing their education out of which around 12,500 are tribal adolescents. A comprehensive Life Skills based Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH) Education Program is being implemented at the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS). The intervention has been implemented to enhance the knowledge and skills of the students on life skills and SRH through class room transaction at school level and peer education at college level. In the past six years, KISS has emerged as resource agency having a critical mass of resource persons. A wide range of communication and resource material with socio-cultural palatability has also been developed. From the year 2012 to 2014, KISS extended technical support in the implementation of the LSE based SRH education programme in 500 residential schools of the government which included 318 SSD high schools and 182 KGBVs in phased manner reaching out to 70,000 adolescents from the disadvantaged communities. One of the remarkable achievements of the initiative was scaling up of the Life Skills Education programme in tribal residential schools in direct partnership with the government. From 2015, the programme is being scaled up by the ST & SC Development Department, Government of Odisha. The main focus during 2015 was on promoting research on the area of ARSH through post graduate students of KISS itself.

In 2016, intervention not only limited to strengthening the LSE-SRH activities in KISS but due focus was given on empowering adolescents to access counselling and SRH services at KISS. Peer Education approach for promoting ARSH at school level in Class VIII and IX was introduced. It supplemented the existing strategy where nodal teachers are transacting life skills sessions in the classroom. The activities like training of newly inducted teachers, reorientation of existing nodal teachers, training of peer educators at school level and refresher training of peer educators at college level were accomplished. Need based resource and communication materials on ARSH were adopted and developed for reference of students and teachers. Support for Menstrual hygiene and counseling services continued. A robust mechanism was adopted for management and maintenance of the sanitary napkin manufacturing unit. Management of sanitary napkin manufacturing unit continued to be co-funded by the institute.

II. Objectives of the intervention:

- A. To enhance knowledge and skills among 12,500 adolescents of tribal and disadvantaged communities on SRH through life skills education at KISS
- B. To promote healthy menstrual hygiene practices among adolescent girls studying at the Institute

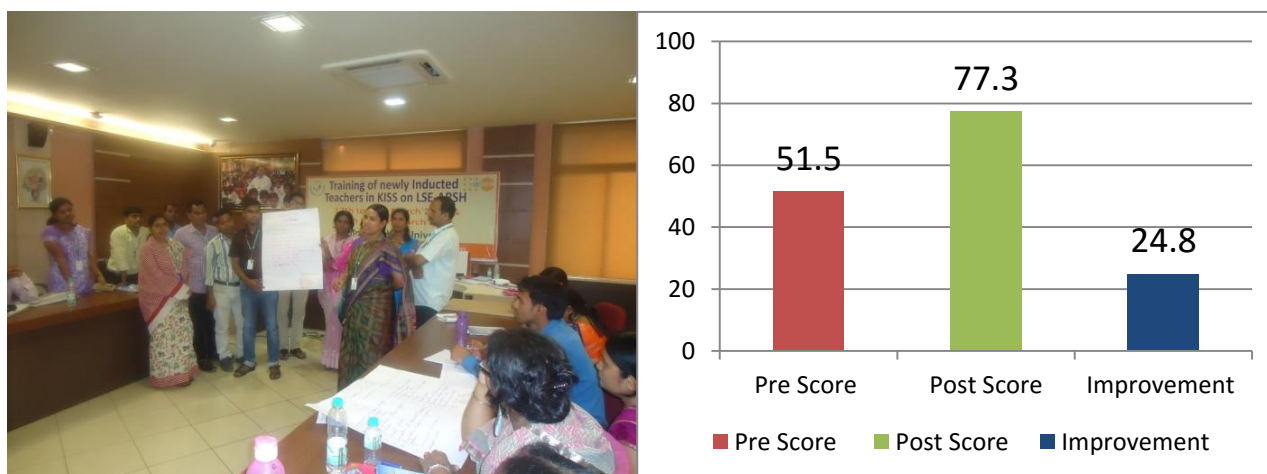
III. Highlight of activities Undertaken in the year 2016:

Activity01: Strengthen Life Skills Based SRH Education for enhancing knowledge and skills among adolescents as well as creating an enabling environment for safer growing up process

The nodal teachers are transacting LSE sessions in the class room as per the fixed time table and peer education is being promoted at the college level. Capacity building training of newly recruited teachers were organized for building a common understanding on the program as well as to train them on importance of life skills based sexual and reproductive health education for safer and informed growing up process. Weekly peer educators meetings were organized, their dairies were reviewed and they were encouraged to discuss on different SRH issues with students.

Training of newly induced teachers in KISS on LSE-SRH

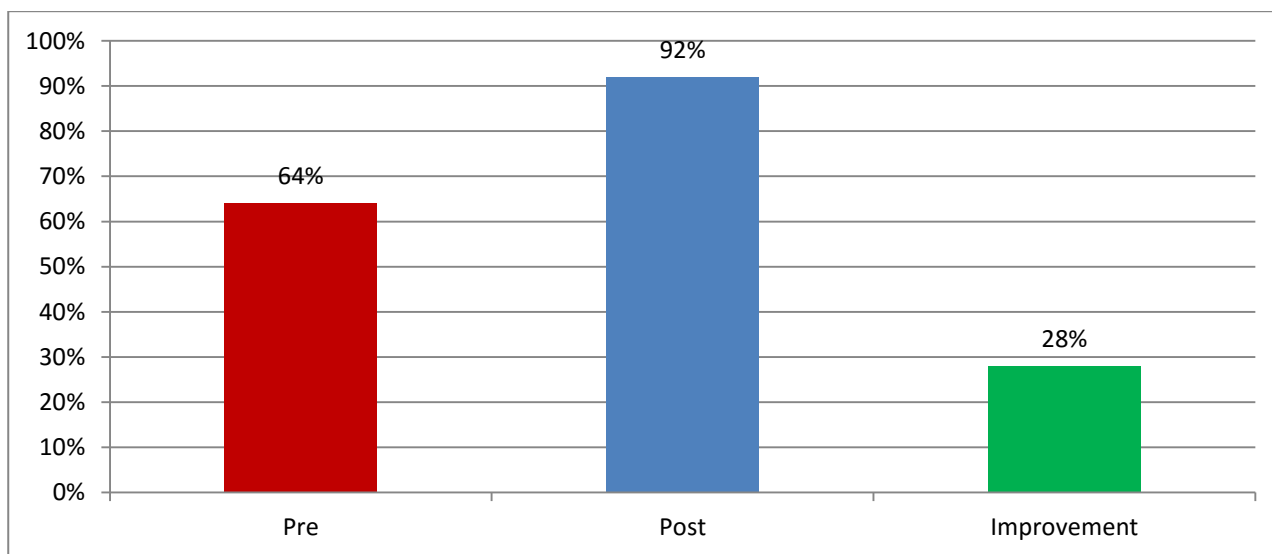
Three days training programme was organized for newly induced teachers on LSE based SRH



education programme. Sixty one (61) newly induced teachers were trained in two batches and training was organized at KISS from 17th to 19th March and 28th to 30th March'2016. The training helped the teachers in understanding the importance of LSE based SRH education for safer and informed growing up process for adolescents and developing their capacity in transacting LSE sessions in class. During the training, teachers were trained on ten core life skills, personal hygiene, changes during adolescence, sexual and reproductive health, menstruation, conception, contraception, RTI/STI, HIV/AIDs and nutrition related issues. Also, teachers were oriented on effective use of different resource and communication materials while imparting LSE sessions. Internal resource persons along with PMU member facilitated the training. **(Refer Annexure II & III for list of participants & schedule in the training).** The post assessment shows that there is substantial increase in knowledge level of teachers after the training.

Reorientation of 90 teachers on LSE-SRH at KISS for 3 days

Three days reorientation training was organized for KISS teachers on LSE based SRH education programme. Ninety three (93) teachers were reoriented in three batches and training was organized at KISS from 25th to 27th, 28th to 30th April'16 and 2nd to 4th May'2016. The training helped the teachers in refreshing their knowledge and developing their capacity in transacting LSE sessions in class. During the training, teachers were reoriented on personal hygiene, changes during adolescence, sexual and reproductive health, menstruation, conception, contraception, RTI/STI, HIV/AIDs, Child Rights and nutrition related issues. Also, teachers were oriented on effective use of different resource and communication materials while imparting LSE sessions. Internal resource persons along with PMU member facilitated the training. **(Refer Annexure IV & V for list of participants & schedule of the training).** The post assessment shows that there was substantial increase in knowledge level of teachers after the training.



Selection and training of Peer Educators at school level:

In a participatory approach, 127 students of class 8th and 9th were selected as peer educators. LSE Nodal Teachers, Class Coordinators and headmaster scrutinized a pool of 250 students from each class on the basis of their interest, knowledge on the Life Skill and ARSH, leadership ability and good communication skill. Further, Project Manager, LSE and nodal teachers had small group meetings and interactions with the students. The list was finalized with one boy and one girl from each section not having any role in the campus with other activities such as Junior Red Cross,

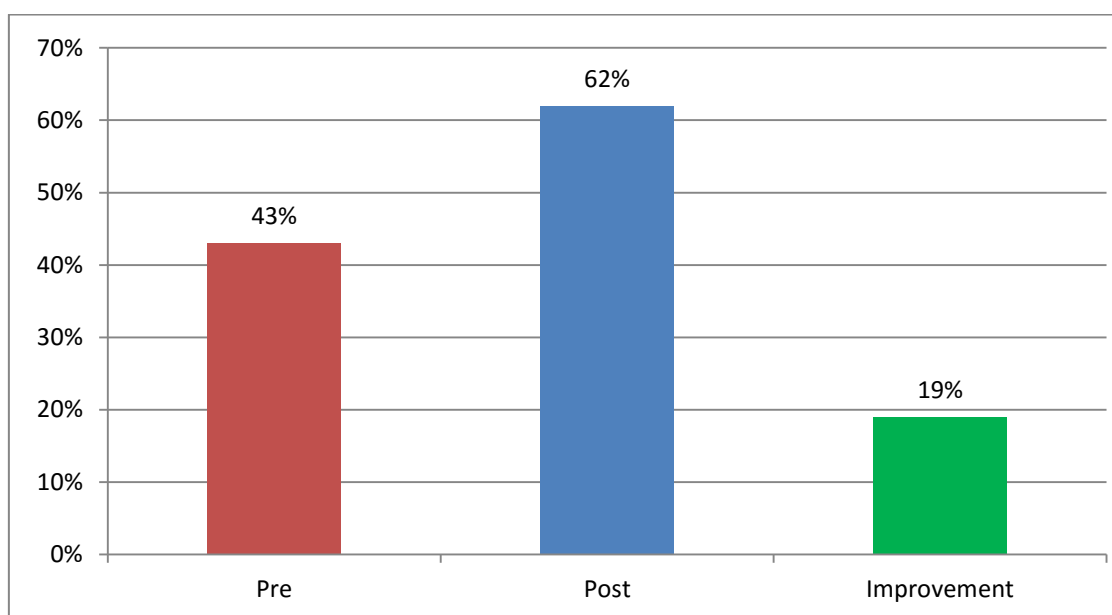
Scout and Guide, Cup and Bulbul so that their involvement and commitment towards being a peer educator will be more.

The five days residential induction training in two slots on life skill and ARSH issues was organized for these selected 127 peer educators of class 8th and 9th at Disaster Preparedness Training



Centre, Red Cross Bhavan from 6th to 10th and 19th to 23rd September'2016. The training helped them to better internalize life skills and gather more information on ARSH issues. During the training, peer educators were trained on personal hygiene, changes during adolescence, sexual and reproductive health, menstruation, conception, contraception, RTI/STI, HIV/AIDs, Child Rights and nutrition related issues and the concept of

peer education and their role and responsibilities. Also, peer educators were oriented on effective use of different resource and communication materials while promoting peer education. Internal resource persons along with PMU member facilitated the training. **(Refer Annexure VI & VII for list of participants & schedule of the training)**. The post assessment shows that there was substantial increase in knowledge level of peer educators after the training.



Selection and Training of Peer Educators at College level:

A list of 150 students from each stream of Arts, Science and Commerce were identified in a participatory approach by senior peer educators, nodal teachers and principal based on their interest, knowledge on the Life Skill and ARSH, leadership ability and a good communication skill. Then through a written test focus on knowledge, interest and aptitude, 64 students were selected as peer educators.

The two batches of five days residential induction training on life skill and ARSH issues was organized for these selected 64 peer educators at Disaster Preparedness Training Centre, Red Cross Bhavan from 7th to 11th and 15th to 19th November'2016. The training helped them to better internalize life skills and gather more information on ARSH issues. During the training, peer educators were trained on personal hygiene, changes during adolescence, sexual and reproductive health, menstruation,



conception, contraception, RTI/STI, HIV/AIDs, Child Rights and nutrition related issues and the concept of peer education and their role and responsibilities. Also, peer educators were oriented on effective use of different resource and communication materials while promoting peer education. Internal resource persons along with PMU member facilitated the training. **(Refer Annexure VIII & IX for list of participants & schedule of the training)**. The post assessment shows that there was substantial increase in knowledge level of peer educators after the training. Further, reorientation training was organized especially for female peer educators on ARSH issues on 27th December'2017 for better clarification and understanding of SRH issues.

Refresher Training of existing Peer Educators on ARSH issues:

The three days residential refresher training in two batches on ARSH issues was organized for 66 peer educators at Disaster Preparedness Training Centre, (DPTC) Red Cross Bhavan from 22nd to



24th and 25th to 27th August'2016. Besides, sessions on laws and legislations related to children and women were facilitated in the training. The training helped the peer educators to get more information on ARSH issues and clarify their doubts. During the training, peer educators were trained on personal hygiene, changes during adolescence, sexual and reproductive health, menstruation, conception, contraception, RTI/STI,

HIV/AIDs, Child Rights and nutrition related issues Internal resource persons along with PMU member facilitated the training. **(Refer Annexure X & XI for list of participants & schedule of the training)**. The post assessment shows that there was substantial increase in knowledge level of peer educators after the training.

Community level awareness through Peer educators:

During summer vacation, the community awareness month was organized starting from 12th May to 12th June' 2016. During this period 75 trained peer educators of 75 villages covering 59 Blocks and 17 districts of the State were engaged in different activities such as promoting health, hygienic practices, ARSH through group meetings, rallies, focus group discussions, peer counseling, drawing competitions and so on among their peers and rural adolescents. Besides, community level stakeholders viz Panchyat Raj Institution members (PRIs), Aganwadi Workers (AWWs,) Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), Female Health workers (FHW) and village leaders were also sensitized. As part of awareness generation on Life Skills and ARSH among adolescents at community level, peer educators organized Community Awareness Programs in their respective villages. IEC materials were used by Peer Educators for internalizing SRH issues among adolescents.



Further, leaflets in Odia on SRH issues were distributed for wider dissemination of information. The



purpose of the program was to disseminate Life Skills amongst the adolescent children of the tribal area, as well as to encourage the denizens to promote and adopt LSE in their day to day life. Moreover, it was focused to promote health and hygiene practices, specifically reproductive health through Life Skills development among their peers and rural adolescents. Issues of age at marriage,

teenage pregnancy, RTI.STIs, HIV/AIDs, substance misuse and myths misconception associated with menstruation were discussed at length among adolescent girls and mother. This program directly benefitted 3500 rural adolescents immensely to manage their SRH concerns. (***Refer Annexure – XII for Peer Educator CAP plan).***)

The activity report of peer educators was compiled and documented into a report in hiring a consultant. The report was printed and shared with Government and CBOs for better understanding of the issues at the grass root level.

Life Skill Based SRH Education Sessions:

LSE sessions in classes are being transacted as per the fixed period allotted in the school timetable. Monthly themes have been fixed and accordingly teachers transacts the sessions. In order to promote group learning, LSE sessions are envisaged to be an activity based sessions. Hence, participatory methodology such as brainstorming, case studies, group work, role play and such others techniques are used for transaction of LSE sessions by trained nodal teachers. Various communication and resource materials such as thematic charts, case studies, facilitators guide have been provided to teachers to facilitate in organizing LSE sessions. By the end of December'2016, out of planned 20 sessions on an average 16 sessions have been completed in all classes. Broad thematic areas which were covered under these (16) sessions are prevention of communicable disease, personal hygiene and nutrition, growing up and changes during adolescence and early marriage and teenage Pregnancy, RTI/STI and HIV/AIDs, Child Rights and Sexual Abuse. In total, 7561 adolescent students reached out through classroom transaction of LSE sessions.

Coordination and Planning Meetings:

Regular Monthly review and planning meetings were held at PMU level to carry out the planned activities in the quarter. Besides, as planned in every quarter, coordination and planning meeting was held with SPC and SPO at UNFPA State office to review the status of the program as well as plan for the subsequent quarter. Further, from time to time guidance was also taken from SPC/SPO, UNFPA for organizing the planned activities.

Activity 02: Promote menstrual hygiene among adolescent girls in the institute

Adolescent friendly counseling and health services are essential facets of ARSH programmes. Identified teachers have been trained and are providing counseling services at KISS. UNFPA supported sanitary napkin production unit is operational and sanitary pads are being manufactured. KISS is also sharing the operational cost including that of HR for managing these centres. It is catering the needs of adolescent girls. Thirty (30) teachers were trained on counseling skills and techniques. In-house teacher counselors are providing counseling support to students and in case of any health issues they are referred to KISS dispensary for medical checkup. The counseling sessions by teachers is helping students in addressing myths associated with menstruation.



Promoting menstrual hygiene and Counseling services:

Trained teachers in counseling and peer educators are closely interacting with the adolescents in informal setting and helping students to overcome their problem related to sexual and reproductive health and other issues. The sanitary napkin production unit is being used for production of sanitary pads. Health attendants and lady hostel supervisors are engaged in preparation of pads. Besides, students in their leisure are also involved for manufacturing these pads.

Capacity Building training of Teacher Counselors on counseling:



A three day training programme for identified teachers was organized on from 14th to 16th Machy'2016 where 29 teachers were trained on counseling. The training was facilitated by Programme Manager, LSE. The sessions were taken by psychologist and adolescent health expert who imparted training on basics of counseling skills, stages, principles and process involved in effective counseling and issues related to adolescent reproductive sexual health. In order to make it interactive, participatory technique (such as group discussions, role play, brain storming, case studies) were used. In addition to it mock counseling sessions were organized and on site feedback was provided by the expert. Further, different psychological tools were administered among the teachers for assessing their capacity as counselors and accordingly feedback was provided to each of them. **(X III & XIV for list of participants & schedule of the training)**. Half

day reorientation training for f teacher counselors was organized on 23rd December'2016 to understand children issues and guide them for better counseling.

Printing of resource and communication materials:

For the reference of nodal teachers and students, Life skill education session calendar of 2016 – 2017 was printed and fixed in each classroom. The life skill education work book was adopted from Technical Support Unit (TSU), LSE, SCSTRTI and 8000 copies were printed and distributed among students of Class 6th to 9th. Besides, 300 flip books on ARSH and Substance misuse was adopted, translated and developed for reference of peer educators and teachers.

Other Activities:

Visit of UNFPA Country Representative and other UNFPA delegates:

Mr. Diego Palacios, Country Representative, UNFPA visited KISS on 15th November'2016 to witness UNFPA supported LSE porgramme at the institute. During his visit, he addressed 25,000 students and appealed to them to follow their dreams and voice for their rights especially sexual reproductive health and rights and gender equality. Mr. Palacios interacted with Dr. Achyut Samanta, Founder and other senior officials and discussed about the UNFPA supported LSE based SRH education program.



Ms. Ingrid FitzGerald, Technical Adviser, Gender and Human Rights and **Ms. Sujata Tuladhar**, Technical Specialist, Violence against Women visited KISS on 21st June'2016. They had an interaction with students and teachers about the process and impact of the intervention. They also visited the UNFPA supported Sanitary Napkin Manufacturing Unit and appreciated the step in managing the menstrual hygiene of adolescent girls

Presentation of Research Papers in National Conference:

In 2015, UNFPA supported KISS in promoting research on ARSH issues. Accordingly, 15 research topics (such as issues of early marriage, HIV/AIDs, Anemia, substance misuse and reproductive health) were carried out and completed by 15 Post Graduate students of the institute (Social Work, Anthropology, Sociology, Political science and Tribal Studies stream) under the guidance of Research Advisory Committee of KISS. In the present year out of 15 research topics,



two papers by PG students of KISS selected for presentation at **“National Conference on Empowering Adolescent Girls: Understanding Realities and Expanding Capabilities”** organized by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Chennai on 22nd and 23rd March’2016. The selected papers were “Myths, Misconceptions & Taboos as barriers of Empowerment of Adolescent Girls in the slums of Bhubaneswar” and “Issues Affecting Tribal Girls: A case study of Jashipur block in Mayurbhunj districts of Odisha”. It was widely appreciated by the panel members and audience who came to attend the programme.

Pretesting of Adolescent Education Programme (AEP) questionnaire:

United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in partnership with UNESCO and UNICEF has planned to undertake assessment of Adolescent Education Programme (AEP)/ Life Skills Education (LSE) Programme. The pre testing of AEP questionnaires for students, teachers and headmasters was conducted at KISS on 8th and 9th February’2016. The feedback was shared with UNFPA Country office as per the prescribed format. The whole process was facilitated by SPO, UNFPA with support of Director (P&R), KISS and Project Manager, LSE, KISS.



Participation in the UN DPI / NGO conference:

The 66th United Nations Department of Public Information (DPI)/Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) Conference was held at Gyeongju, Republic of Korea from the 30th of May to 1st of June 2016 on the thematic area *“Education for Global Citizenship: Achieving the Sustainable Development Goals together,”* Co-sponsored by the NGO/DPI Executive Committee. The conference aimed to finalize an education action agenda and mobilize the global



civil society around the Sustainable Development Goals. Four delegates from KISS participated in the conference and presented the KISS model of education including the role of Life Skill Education towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

Participation in the NCERT/UNFPA Material Development Workshop:

Four students of class IX and two nodal teachers participated in the training and resource materials development workshop for upper primary classes at NCERT, New Delhi from 27th to 30th

September'2016 jointly organized by UNFPA and NCERT. Content experts and creative content developers facilitated the workshop for development of age appropriate AEP curriculum. Students and teachers contributed in sharing their experiences while transacting LSE sessions at KISS. They also shared the resource and communication materials developed at KISS on Life Skill and ARSH issues.



Selection of Peer Educator as Ashoka Youth Venturer:

In August' 2016, Shanti Murmu, peer educator of Life Skill Education Program was selected as Ashoka Youth Venturer by the Ashoka Innovators for the Public, India for her project "PARIVARTAN" which aims at promoting life skills education as a tool of addressing early marriage



of girls, their school drop-out, myths and misconception associated with menstruation and consumption of local liquor, tobacco (*gutkha* and *tambakhu*) etc in her community. For her passion & commitment to bring social change at such a young age, she was recognized as Ashoka Youth Venture. After getting selected, she will now receive support in the form of extensive mentorship and training through a structured program, and become part of

Ashoka's Global network of Social Innovators & Entrepreneurs.

Participation in Delhi Youth Dialogue:

Ms. Shanti Murmu, a peer educator of Life Skill Education program participated in the Delhi Youth Dialogue between United Nations Assistant Secretary General and UN Women's Deputy Executive Director on 10th September'2016 at New Delhi. The event was organized by UN Women and the objective was to create a platform for an intergenerational dialogue with young women and men on their leadership to achieve gender equality. Shanti presented her ideas on promoting ARSH knowledge among adolescents and gender perspectives highlighting education of girl child and domestic violence.

Evaluation of Life Skill Education Program:

As part of UNFPA-8th Country Programme evaluation, **Ms. Shireen Jeejibhoy**, an independent national adolescent health expert and **Prof. Lakshmi Lingam**,



Professor, Tata Institute of Social Science, Mumbai visited KISS on 25th May and 18th July'2016 respectively to understand the Life Skill Education Program at KISS, its different components, advocacy efforts undertaken for scaling it up with government and further to assess its contribution in increasing access to information on gender sensitive SRH issues. They had discussions with senior officials of KISS, teachers, peers and students about the inception of Life skills education program, implementation and benefits.

Participation in Annual Parents Meet of KISS:

During December 2016, 25th annual parents meet was held where one of the stall on Life skills Education Programme was also installed. Parents were sensitized on the LSE based SRH education programme. Various resource and communication materials were displayed and peer educators explained to parents about the benefit of the program. Around 30,000 parents of tribal communities participated in the annual parents meet.



V. Conclusion:

During the year, all planned activities were carried out in timely manner. Sixty one (61) newly recruited teachers were trained on LSE-SRH for building their understanding about the program and orienting them on transacting classroom sessions. 93 KISS teachers were reoriented on ARSH issues for understanding and resolving their challenges or any specific issues while transaction sessions in classes. 127 and 64 peer educators at school and college level respectively were selected and trained to promote LSE-SRH in formal and informal settings. Refresher training on ARSH issues for 66 peer educators was organized for better understanding and clarifying their doubts. Around 8,600 students were directly reached out through transaction of LSE sessions in classroom set up. 3500 rural adolescents were reached out through the community awareness program by peer educators during summer vacation. Sanitary napkin production units are fully operational with regular staff deployed by the institute.

Further, students benefitted in managing their problems through counseling sessions by teacher's trained in counselling. Capacity building of 30 teacher as counselors was developed in a three days training program on counseling skills and techniques. Need based Resource and communication materials were developed and adopted for use of peer educators and teachers.

In the coming years, effort will be made to institutionalize the program in KISS. Classroom transaction at school level and Peer Education activities at college level will be strengthened. One of the challenges is to document the influence of life skills education programme on students who have passed out from the institute and also to compare the behavior change especially in context of SRH in students studying at KISS and their counterparts residing in remote tribal villages. The same will be attempted in 2017.

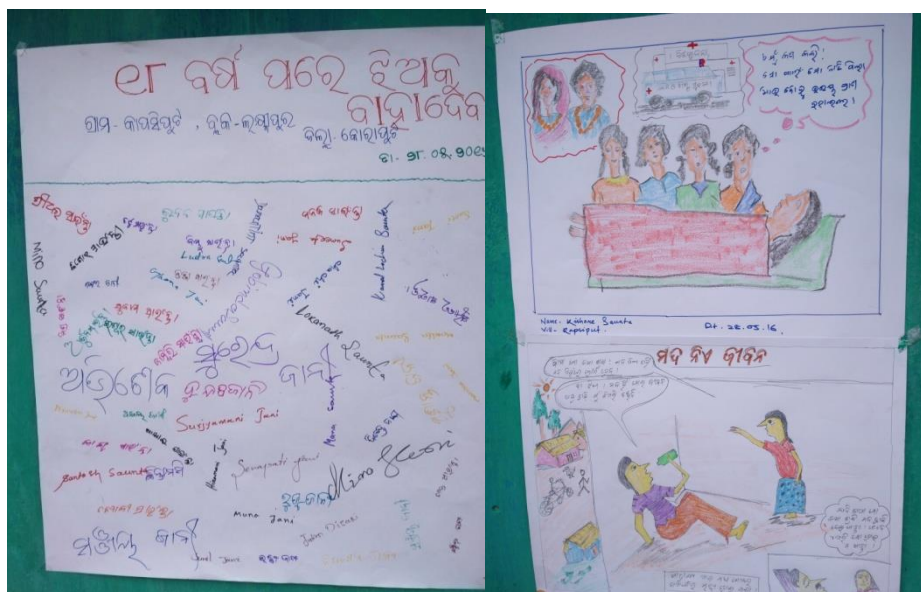
