### FOUNDER'S MESSAGE

Human beings, the most evolved living beings on earth are constantly being challenged by a virus that is teaching this generation what a pandemic means. The moment we think we have got a shield against this microorganism, it mutates into new and innovative variants to spread faster. Even in its third wave, it is wreaking havoc, for it may sound mild, but it may be just slightly milder than previous variants. History bears testimony to the fact that in case of calamities - natural or man-made, the poor are the worst sufferers. The families are further pushed to margins and food, health and education - basic rights are compromised first. The ongoing Covid-19 pandemic in its course has taken a huge toll on the education of children. Though officially there has been no disruption in academic calendar and most of the schools and colleges have taken to online education, the learning outcomes have not been appealing. In the rural hinterlands of the country, where superstition rules supreme, network connectivity is dismal and poverty persists, online education has still not made its proper stride and a new normal is yet to come. Millions of students, especially tribal children who were at state sponsored education or were receiving education and boarding facilities free of cost are back home for more than a year. Not initially, but as the year passed by, they have been taken as helping hands in the field and household chores. The instances of abuse, neglect and exploitation have also increased. For the girls from poverty-stricken families one cannot possibly rule out the most dreadful consequence of the current predicament - being coerced into child labor and child trafficking and marriage.

Many of them have lost parent/s to the virus. Child Marriage, begging, trafficking, Child Labour have been the side effects of lockdowns imposed to control the spreading of the Coronavirus. In the most deprived tribal pockets, the children are first-generation formal school-goers. The alternate spaces to supplement school learning, socialization, and holistic development of the children are missing in their homes away from the cities.

The transition to virtual teaching is not as exciting and accommodating. Now that the teachers and the students are accustomed to online classes, we must also understand that the classrooms are not mere walls. A physical classroom is a constellation of shared conversations and stories, games and altercations, care and friendships, and love and inspiration. Schools become more than just a place for learning for the poor children—they provide food and nutrition, psychological and in some cases, economic assistance.

In such a grim scenario, where the students at the margins may not come back to schools, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) located in Bhubaneswar, Odisha is leaving no stones unturned to stay in touch with the students, keeping them motivated and counselling parents who would support their children to receive online education in innovative style catering to the local needs. KISS is a home for 30,000 tribal students from Odisha and neighboring states pursuing their studies from Grade I to Postgraduate and Doctoral level. It provides lodging, boarding, education, vocational skills and sports training free of cost to the students.

Even before education, comes the basic need to survive and nutrition. Holistic nutrition has been a big challenge for tribal children in various Indian states but the onset of the Coronavirus has made it even more difficult for them to get proper nutrition. KISS has been delivering dry food, grocery, medicines and sanitation requirements at their doorstep even in the remotest corners of Odisha for over a year now. As the students stay in their homes, they should not be considered a burden. Infact, KISS is taking care of the nutrition requirements of the parents as well so that the children can focus on academics.

In such testing times, the students have to be mentally very strong and motivated. The mentors at KISS are in constant touch with their mentees over phone, WhatsApp groups and taking all briefs about academics, life at home, exercise and physical activity and the like.

The strong mentor - mentee relation and camaraderie among the mentees of the same mentor has worked wonders and kept the students positive. Books, stationery material and requirements are sent to the students at their doorstep. Initially education began with classes on Whatsapp. It gradually went to zoom for the ones who had network in the villages.

But for those who didn't have a phone at home or network connectivity, our representative from the district reached home and delivered materials and connected with a senior of the same village or block for doubt clearing. KISS in collaboration with Kalinga TV started e-classes for transition year students. The classes by teachers in the smart classrooms are shot and the videos are sent to the students for the ones who have multimedia phones and network connectivity. The solutions have been offered on the basis of needs.

Parents, Guardians, Alumni and tribal leaders have been involved in this process as well. KISS conducted Mega Guardians Meet online because of the pandemic. This decentralized governance and decision making based on inputs from stakeholders make all the solutions offered at KISS very sustainable. With the uncertainties surrounding the Pandemic, one thing is certain and clear that holistic mentoring, timely support, localized need based solutions, community involvement and inspiration can go a long way in ensuring the tribal children back in their homes keep connected with their school and academics.

Reopening is not like flipping a switch and returning to normal. Even with a gradual approach. we are going to focus on major changes in daily operations to prevent a recurrence of the virus or other outbreaks. Meanwhile, we have done various intervention programmes for girl students so that they don't drop out. The recent wave of the pandemic hints at disturbing trends leading towards uncertainties across the fronts. However, it is certain that by virtue of our commendable experience in COVID management we would positively execute the safety measures and reach out to our students, guardians and alumni. I have a strong conviction that we will certainly move forward and continue to conquer COVID - 19, prioritizing education and welfare of our students. I reiterate commitment to contribute wholeheartedly while working for our mission to achieve zero hunger, zero poverty, zero illiteracy.



# Addressing Tribal Education



#### TRIBAL POPULATION

Eight percent of India's population is tribal. Despite the constitutional promise of social justice and protection through affirmative action, India's tribal population lives in deplorable conditions in the country's dense forests and remote hinterlands.



#### **CUSTODIANS OF EARTH**

These original inhabitants (Adivasi) live a simple & sustainable life, with food grown/ foraged in forests, medicines grown from indigenous plants and their own forms of learning and knowledge, often through tales and oral history passed down from preceding generations.



#### CYCLE OF POVERTY

Each tribe boasts a rich cultural heritage that is unique from the next; unfortunately, however, tribes across the country are united by the vicious cycle of poverty and insufficient access to formal learning.

#### REMOTE LOCATIONS

Since tribes inhabit remote forests/ hilly terrains, this inhibits their access to adequate healthcare or educational facilities.



#### **GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS**

The few government or private schools that do exist are largely in residential format, to address the challenges presented by rural underdevelopment.





#### LEARNING CHALLENGES

Early learning for youth at these schools is compromised by problems such as poor infrastructure, teacher absenteeism, lack of toilets, language gaps between tribal and mainstream languages, additional school associated costs or familial pressure to handle siblings and dropout in favour of working and earning.

# Our journey thus far



#### FOUNDING KISS

To ameliorate the suffering of impoverished tribal communities, KISS was founded in the early 90s by philanthropist and educator. Dr. Achyuta Samanta. He himself faced severe hunger, poverty & loss as a child, and made it his lifelong mission to diminish the sufferings of others, particularly Odisha's many tribal communities. Dr. Samanta firmly believes **accessible** & affordable education is key to this, and thus KISS was crafted as a completely free of cost model from this selfless dream.

#### RESIDENTIAL MODEL

Our residential campus in Bhubaneswar is the result of a conscious decision considering factors like the availability of teachers in urban areas, the higher dropout rate in day schools, and education in a far-off capital city ensuring that our students are safe from the clutches of Naxalites. Moreover the spread of Odisha's 62 tribes throughout the 30 districts meant that creating a centralised structure in the capital city with access to all resources was essential for KISS to become a centre of education for tribal youth.





#### ADIVASI REVOLUTION

We have always firmly adhered to the principle of having indigenous control of education and taking pride in our diverse tribal cultures, art, dance, languages, folklore and so on. From starting with 125 children in 1993, we are now home to over 60,000 youth across the country, and nurture a **dream of educating 2 million of India's poorest children over the next decade.** Over the last 2 decades, we have learned & grown alongside the indigenous community, working with more than 150,000 individuals.

The reason is simple - statistics show, that more than 171 million people could be lifted out of extreme poverty if all children graduated from school with basic reading skills.

Not only this, education reduces economic disparities and promotes economic growth, with an increase in individual earnings by roughly 10% for each additional year of schooling. Thus, the most basic way to empower people is to arm them with a good education.

To this end, we provide holistic, quality education completely free of cost, to over 30,000 indigenous students. In addition to regular classes, we also offer career preparation aid to students, in addition to skill training and vocational training.

We are also extending our schooling model to other districts of Odisha and other states in partnership with various State governments and CSR activities of private organisations and corporate houses.

# WE WORK TOWARDS ZERO HUNGER & BETTER HEALTH

# Because health & food security are paramount

While KISS' mission focuses on education, we also understand, that to help our students grow, we must listen to what our communities need and adapt accordingly. Millions of people are hungry or undernourished, while large numbers are chronically overweight due to a poor diet. Smallholder farmers produce more than one-third of the world's food, yet are some of the worst affected by poverty, as agriculture continues to be an unpredictable and often unsafe sector. This means, that working on food security and water aid for indigenous communities, helps in ensuring that our children can grow up strong and healthy... so that they have the chance to succeed in school in the future!

Providing good nutrition is essential towards our goal of ending hunger and contributing towards food security and sustainable agriculture in Odisha. To this end, more than 1 lakh meals are prepared daily for our students in an impressive, award winning steam-based kitchen, which has been featured in a National Geographic documentary on India's Mega Kitchens. Efforts like these have helped KISS drastically reduce malnutrition amongst its incoming indigenous students.

In addition to this, KISS is also implementing groundbreaking collaborative research to reduce food insecurity in Odisha. The first such project is the TIGR2ESS project with the University of Cambridge, which aims to deliver sustainable agricultural practices and improve food security while promoting equal opportunities and enhancing nutrition and health for rural communities in Odisha. Additionally, CHIRAG is a Global Research Translation award (GRTA) project, funded by UK Research Innovations (UKRI) on Sustainable Food Systems. KISS is collaborating with University of East Anglia, UK, in this project along with other Indian Partners - PRADAN and Gramvaani. It aims to bring together information on particular production choices, technologies, diets and consumption practices and their relationship to health and nutrition outcomes. This will be achieved by Community led platform for knowledge generation & exchange and constituency-level round tables to bring together various stakeholders.

KISS has also provided food relief to the marginalized and the needy for the last two years of ongoing pandemic.



**SOME INNOVATIVE INITIATIVES AT KISS** 

### Earn while you Learn

KISS' "Earn While You Learn" programme provides opportunities for students to earn while they are learning through part-time jobs and entrepreneurial projects thus preparing them to shoulder professional assignments with relative ease. It is implemented through vocational training and skill development. KISS has been identified as a Centre of Excellence for Skill and Vocational Training by UNDP.

Under this programme, students receive skill development and vocational training in one of over 50 trades as per their interests and talent. This programme is designed to build vocational skills in specialised areas for marketable skills, which will enable our students to find gainful engagement in their future careers, thus not only providing employability training but also developing sensible artistic approaches to self-expression for our students.



# **HOW IT**

WORKS

#### TRAINING

Different levels of vocational training and skill development are imparted to students, who are first divided into 4 age groups – sub-junior, junior, senior and super-senior. Each student is trained in a trade of his/her interest, with vocational training running concurrent to formal education from classes VI to X



#### **PRODUCTION**



Large-scale products made as a result of these vocational activities are readily saleable in the market. KIIT, our sister university, with more than 30,000 students and staff, needs these products in large numbers and is a ready market

#### SALE

One-third of the surplus earned from the sale of each product is distributed among the children engaged in a particular vocational activity. This way, each student manages to earn at least Rs. 700 to Rs. 1000 per month, alongside their free education, realising the goal of the "earn while you learn" programme.



#### SUPPORT



Students can either send this money to their parents or deposit it in the bank for future use. More importantly, they can acquire skills in a vocational trade that will empower them after graduation, with a skill that will enable them to earn a livelihood, aside from academic-related pursuits.

### English Access Micro-scholarship Program

The English Access Microscholarship Program (Access Program) is an exciting initiative of the U.S. Department of State. This highly effective training program is designed to provide a significant English-language learning experience to bright non-elite 13 to 21 year-old students. It also has the goal of improving students' appreciation of U.S. culture and values, encouraging critical thinking and open-mindedness, and improving performance regular in school classes.In KISS, the program a foundation of English language skills to 950 talented indigenous students. The programs separately from 2009-2012, 2011-2013, 2013-2015, 2015-2017, 2017-2019 and 2020-2023 have been and implemented by KISS.

Several innovative teaching aids have been prepared to motivate the students to shed off their fear and learn the language. The Access Program has also helped build their personality. The framework adopted includes orallearner-centered and activity-The based approach. activities undertaken to fulfill the aim include project work, activities that promote reading with comprehension, quiz, roleskits, dialogue, dramatization, play, discussion, debate, language games, simulating, real life situation, using newspaper clipping, multimedia, using internet, movies, music, riddles and puzzles, pair work and group work. Enhancement activities in the form of exposure visits to shopping Malls, Planetarium, Nandankanan Zoo, Tribal Museum etc are also adopted.Tribal children are the most marginalized as compared to others. They have to learn their own language, language of the state, national language and English language for higher education. Many of our English Access tribal students have been successful in joining specialized higher education like Law, Engineering (B.Tech), Medicine (MBBS), Diploma in

various engineering trades and Social Sciences. It is unprecedented in the tribal history that the benefit of Access program has touched students even from Primitive-Tribes consequentially acquiring higher studies, which needs a high degree of English proficiency. Largely Access Program in KISS has curbed the further alienation and has contributed to integration of Tribal children.

Only concerted and collaborative effort by the industry and academia can meet this challenge. Hence, Bosch has joined hands with select Universities to work on skill development.

A draft national education policy released by India's government in 2019 calls for fundamentally restructuring the country's higher education system. The draft policy call for greater emphasis on vocational training in the country.

We believe that Universities, as the temples of knowledge and powerhouses of wisdom, are the best places where youth can not only get knowledge, but also hands on skills with industry-relevant practical exposure to become job-ready.

Keeping view to this KISS has partnered with Bosch for the Industry Academia Collaboration for Skill Development initiative. Under this collaboration an Industry Academia Collaboration Centre was established in its premises. The aim of the initiative was to meet the challenge of eliminating unemployment by reaching out to youth in need of skill development and making them employable.



An Industry Academia Collaboration Centre was established at KISS DU Campus. The initiative is facilitated by the Industry Academia Collaboration Lead (IACL) at KISS in collaboration with BOSCH Team. The details of structural framework are given in the below Table 1. The initiative has identified and built capacity of five nos of subject matter experts in the above five domains. They have received adequate knowledge to lead their respective domain activities.

Under the Skill Development of Youth Domain, KISS with the technical support from Bosch have conducted the Skill Entrepreneurship program. The programme aimed to create opportunity for the tribal youths to learn and join the skill eco system of the country and empower the youth in their community.

The Skill Entrepreneurship programme has divided into 4 modules and one identified youth need to go through the 4 modules to become a skill entrepreneur. The details of operational framework of Skill Entrepreneurship programme is given in the below table 2 and Table 3. 

# Mother Tongue-based Multilingual Education

Since its inception, KISS has celebrated the diversity of indigenous languages and dialects. It has consistently focused on imparting classroom teaching in the mother tongue at elementary levels before transitioning to a common language. This one of its kind pioneering effort of KISS took a concrete shape in the form of Mother Tongue-Based Multilingual Education in 2013, with initial support from the Bernard van Leer Foundation.

KISS has sustainably since institutionalised the Multilingual Education Programme, setting other educational example for institutions and governments to impart teaching in indigenous languages. This project won UNESCO's King Sejong Literacy Prize 2022 for its outstanding literacy initiatives.

MTB-MLE is a well-established strategy to address language gaps in early learning. The MTB-MLE programme at KISS is sustained within the formal education system of KISS, allowing the organisation to fill gaps in the learning process of indigenous students. Children at an early learning stage are aided in their education through this approach, by introducing a transition curriculum - an innovative pedagogic initiative, with unique teaching and learning tools created in 10 indigenous dialects. It aims to tackle the challenges retention of indigenous poor students in elementary schools due to classroom language barriers and incapacity deal with teachers' to multilingual and multicultural classrooms effectively. The programme is in a hybrid format with face-to-face and distance learning modules using low-tech solutions such as television, radio, and text messaging.





### **Meraki Python Progrogramming**

Meraki is an android application program developed by NavGurukul Foundation. focused on making and programming digital skills marginalised accessible to the communities, especially girls from different communities, through smartphone, and working to create direct job opportunities or admissions to aspirational training programs to bridge the gender tech-gap.

NavGurukul Foundation and Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences, Deemed to be University (KISS-DU) have collaborated to teach young learners from the 18+ age group from various indigenous communities, build their social and technical skills, empowering them to develop as leaders and be employment ready for the Information Technology sector.

Meraki is a self-paced learning application with live master classes and also offers an offline python compiler, within the app, called Playground to practice coding.

The 1st batch of Meraki Python Programming was successfully run from April- June 2022 with a participation from 50 KISS students with 30 Hours of live master classes along with 30 Hours of self-study.

Another cohort of 80 students of the computer science department will start their Beginner level course from September 2022. After successful completion, a select number of students will move to an advanced course offering projects, on-line boot camps and employment opportunities.













# Mahindra Pride Classroom (MPC) Programme

Mahindra Pride Classroom is a flagship Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Livelihood programme of the Mahindra and Mahindra group and is fully implemented by Naandi Foundation. The program aims to impart employability skills covering the following topics -

An in-person 20-day (40 hours) employability skills training programme for 260 female post-graduate final year students (Arts, Science and Commerce) was conducted in 6 batches by Mahindra Pride Classroom (MPC) at Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) Deemed to be University from 16th August 2022 to 8th September 2022 by two expert trainers from MPC Programme.

The 1st cohort of the program ended by an award distribution ceremony held at KISS Campus-3 where 7 students from each of the 6 batches were awarded various prizes, medals and trophies based on their performances in the program.

Furthermore, as a part of the collaboration, new cohorts consisting of both undergraduate and postgraduate students will participate in the employability training program. There will be introduction of various short skill development programs like Digital Marketing, Tally & GST, Python Programming in the upcoming months to be implemented in smaller batches for interested candidates further connecting them to various employment opportunities.









# **HighRadius Technologies**

Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) in collaboration with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) has initiated the project 'Samarthya', the Life Skills Education for adolescents with disabilities studying in the special schools of Odisha, for promoting their health and well-being, since August 2020. # Enterpreneurship and skill development programs for VDVK members

The Van Dhan Scheme is an initiative of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and TRIFED. It was launched on 14th April, 2018 and seeks to improve tribal incomes through value addition of tribal products. The main objective of the scheme is to Promote sustainable livelihood systems for tribal people by marketing development and ensuring remunerative price for their products, provide minimum price and value support addition of Non-Timber Forest



Produce (Minor Forest Produce), empower them through meticulous capacity building, augment their resources substantially, develop marketing partnership with Central/State Government agencies and other development partners through establishing convergence and coherence in activities. Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), Bhubaneswar sanctioned a project by TRIFED to conduct ESDP training for 156 Van Dhan Vikas Kendra (VDVK) covering 14 tribal districts under 22 ITDAs. ESDP (Entrepreneurship and Skill Development Program) aims at inculcating entrepreneurial culture among Van Dhan community (members of Van Dhan Vikas Kendra). TRIFED selected KISS as training partner, to train around 5000 women directly on enterprenueral skill and provide them mentorship so that 50,000 women's socio-economic status will significantly change.

KISS created 40 master trainers (at local level) to impart ESDP training to the VDVK members in the field. All the 40trainers are been recommended by the respective ITDAs exists in the district. The master trainers are senior experienced persons from developmental background having long experience in working SHG with the community and forest based livelihood. As per commitment KISS has directly trained 2000 Tribal Women Entrepreneurs using 40 master trainers at community level.

# Palanhar Yojana

This project involved the analytical documentation of the "Palanhar Yojana" being implemented by KISS and the Government of Rajasthan as a key alternative care arrangement in collaboration with the Social Justice and Empowerment Department, Government of Rajasthan and UNICEF since May 2022.

The objective of The Palahanr project was to have comprehensive analytical documentation of the scheme's progress & processes as also a holistic assessment of beneficiaries in terms of the impetus given to their lives by Palanhar 1.0 and then analyse how national & global best practices can better inform the (possibly) revamped Palanhar 2.0.





KISS Bhubaneswar was established in 1993 by Dr. Achyuta Samanta with only 125 children in a residential model school at Bhubaneswar and now, it is the largest fully free, fully residential educational institution for more than 60,000 (30,000 Existing, 15,000 Alumni and 15,000 at Satellite Centres) tribal youth. KISS provides holistic education from Class-I to Ph. D along with free lodging, boarding and health care facilities. Besides this, KISS imparts vocational training, life skills education and exposure to sports & athletics.

The students of KISS have qualified and sought admission at reputed national institutes such as IITs, NITs, IIMs and other organisations of international repute and they have also participated and achieved success at the Olympics, ASIAD, CommonWealth, South Asian Federation Games and many other prestigious Sports events at both national and international platforms.

In view of the outstanding contributions of KISS towards academics in teaching-learning, research, extension activities, sports and games; it has been **declared a Deemed to be University Under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt of India, New Delhi** on the basis of the recommendation of the University Grants Commission, (UGC) New Delhi vide their notification No F.9-14/2011-U.3 (A) dated 25th August 2017. This made KISS-DU the first university in the world exclusively for tribals providing fully free and fully residential education along with other facilities. Accordingly, the University has been functioning since the afore-mentioned date with all its U.G, P.G, M.Phil and Ph.D Programs. KISS-DU has been admitting students from Odisha and neighbouring states like Jharkhand, Assam, Mizoram, West-Bengal, Chhattisgarh etc.

It aims to raise its academia bar to new heights by focusing its teaching and research in 'unique and emerging areas of knowledge' related to specific innovative areas, which are not being pursued by any other institution in the W\world. Further, every year, the meritorious students of KISS are enrolled in KIIT Deemed to be University to pursue professional courses, i.e., B. Tech, MBA, MCA, Law, MBBS etc. fully free of cost.

# Celebrating Five Glorious Years of KISS-DU

From a nascent baby to the world's largest learning hub for indigenous communities in the world, KISS has been preceded by so many milestones in its almost three-decadelong existence. The successful completion of five years of KISS Deemed to be University this August, is the latest feather in its cap. It is a remarkable feat for this one-of-a-kind institute that has been conceptualised to provide higher education exclusively to tribal students. Along the way, KISS-DU has recorded some significant milestones and achievements that have helped it reach where it is today. On 15 September, 2017, Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated KISS-DU for being granted the University status, marking the beginning of a successful journey for the institute.

Deemed-to-be University has made a name for itself in a short span of five years, having completed two convocations, and produced three batches of Ph.D. scholars. With the leadership of its visionary founder Dr Achyuta Samanta, and the guidance of a well-rounded team of academicians and professors, KISS-DU is expected to scale great heights in the years to come.

#### **CAREER PREPARATION**

At these classes, special emphasis is placed on preparing students for competitive examinations, conducted by recruitment boards in varied fields, including but not limited to Banking, Railways, and Police Service. We also prepare students for examinations by the Staff Selection Commission, Subordinate Selection Commission, Odisha Public Service Commission (OPSC), Union Public service Commissions (UPSC) etc.

The Committee on CPC sits on weekly basis and review the progress of the Special Coaching Classes as well as the CPC regarding the works done to meet the requirement.



The Committee on CPC also designs the syllabi for various examinations and they modify/update the syllabus as and when needed in order to ensure that the students get appropriate training on the modules.



For over 2 decades, KISS has worked to empower & engage tribal youth and tribal community members by amplifying their voices in multi-stakeholder & multi-platform conversations about the path to a sustainable future - voices that are often underrepresented in global discussions.

The unique vision and effective execution of the KISS Model have been lauded by planners and administrators both nationally and internationally, with a **call for replication** of its innovative approach to indigenous controlled empowerment through education. As KISS' students successfully graduate as empowered alumni with competitive jobs and degrees, the demand for education among tribal communities is also burgeoning.

As a result, KISS has been working to increase its outreach in the State by **setting up model schools in all districts of Odisha**, beginning with districts that have larger populations of marginalised communities. KISS' new schools are being made sustainable and financially self-sustaining through partnership and collaboration with government and non-government agencies. Thus far, KISS is pleased to have inaugurated campuses in Balangir, Baripada, Balasore and Kalahandi. Apart from Odisha, KISS also has a **campus in the National Capital Region of Delhi** in partnership with the Delhi Government and has also incorporated **KISS Foundation USA and KISS Foundation UK** as charitable organisations to receive international donations, grants and contributions towards supporting the education and facilities for its 60,000 indigenous students.

KISS upholds affordable and accessible quality education as the key to mitigating the transmission of cycles of poverty that place India's indigenous communities at a disadvantage, and it is our dream to educate and empower close to 2 million of India's impoverished tribal youth by the end of this decade. Together, with your continued support and encouragement, we're certain we can!

#### HOLISTIC EDUCATION

The model of KISS is unique in providing need-based and demand driven education for indigenous stakeholders; For us, education is not just about empowering the child, but also about providing a starting point for transformation for the family and community as a whole. Through our work, we have found that engaging with a child and his/her family leads to imparting of critical skills such as empathy, collaboration and respect for diversity among indigenous communities.

#### ZERO DROPOUT

KISS provides a model of empowerment for tribal children by shaping and creating a cohort of role models for every tribal & remote village in the country. Throughout the process, KISS addressed 2 major challenges: Diversity & Inclusion. Students not only learn from teachers but from their peers as well. KISS model prepares these vulnerable children as emphatetic problem solvers by making the classroom an inclusive laboratory for their ideas and aspirations. Mother tongue based multilingual education removes language barriers and imparts life skills as part of the curriculum for students to build confidence to be self reliant and active partners of development in the process. A sense of identity is instilled in children & their communities for them to co-own and build the movement of creating opportunities for every tribal and disadvantaged child of the country - a concept that has been spearheaded by the mission of Prof. Achyuta Samanta.






#### GIRL CHILD EMPOWERMENT

With more than 15,000 female students (60% of total strength), KISS has always advocated and practiced Women's Empowerment. At KISS, we focus on empowering our female students enabling them to become local grassroots leaders, doctors, engineers, teachers and civil servants. We practice Gender Equality by ensuring that our female students receive equal exposure as their male counterparts.

#### ARRESTING SOCIAL ILLS

As an institution, KISS is instrumental in helping to arrest drop-out rates, improve health conditions, reduce human trafficking, arrest child marriage & child labour among tribal communities. Moreover, our innovative 'Earn while you Learn' scheme of vocational training, allows students to send money back home, while receiving hands-on learning for livelihood - this programme acts as a catalyst to eradicate extreme poverty and hunger for many marginalised tribal communities of Odisha, India.

#### CONTAINING LEFT-WING EXTREMISM

With the contribution and know how from local grassroots workers about tribal dominated areas prone to left wing extremism, deserving wards from armed insurgent families have been given admission at KISS. Through this process of positive rehabilitation, these students have gone on to excel at academics at KISS. As a result, we have observed an unbelievably sharp decline in terrorist related incidents in these vulnerable districts compared to data shared by the Government of India in previous years. This has paved a way for the mainstreaming of estranged and alienated families through a path of peace, democracy and development. Most students in KISS directly come from insurgent affected districts of Odisha, in addition to another 500 from Bihar, Jharkhand and Chattisgarh. With a KISS education, professional courses and vocational training, these students graduate from our institute as independent empowered youth with jobs in hand.

#### CHANGE MAKERS

The alumni of KISS are placed in many of the most respectable and coveted professions. They have made an indelible mark in the field of academics as well as sports, rising to the level of Olympics. Students have also qualified for coveted elite civil services of the Government of Odisha, reiterating our firm belie that given equal opportunity, there is no limit to what our tribal students can achieve. In fact, the tribal students studying at KISS are often first generation learners of their families, communities and villages as a while, and education allows them to hold their own agency and amplify their voices in their communities, as torchbearers and change agents among lakhs of tribal communities.



#### **GRASSROOTS EMPOWERMENT**

KISS provides technical support to 500 government residential schools in Odisha to impart life skills based training. There are over 100 district resource persons, 500 headmasters, 1500 government teachers trained under this programme. Thus, KISS reaches the unreached, covering 75 villages in 20 districts of Odisha and imparting life skills education to over 1 lakh adolescent boys and girls. Thus at a macro level, it addresses the challenge from a cognitive viewpoint. Projects like 'New Mind, New Dream' and 'Go Back to the Village' enable nearly 2000 staff and students of KISS to visit rural and tribal areas annually, during the summer vacation, inspiring change through a variety of initiatives such as plantation drives, literacy initiatives, awareness campaigns and Life Skills Drives. KISS always tries to inspire change at the grass-root level.

#### CAPACITY TO ASPIRE

KISS is now transforming the lives of more than 0.5 million tribal children indirectly and meeting the hopes and aspiration of tribal populations for more than two decades, through interventions in the areas of education, employment, vocational, health, climate change while embodying and inspiring an ideology of peace and development for sustainable development of tribal communities.

# IS CHANGING LIVES



#### MS. TULASI HANSADAH

Nursing Officer (Grade II) AIMS, Hyderabad

A promising, confident and spirited nursing care functionary at AIMS, Hyderabad, Ms. Tulasi Hansada from Golagadia village of Keonjhar, was born on 8 July, 1992 to poor and illiterate Santal parents. Her family depended on farming for livelihood. However, education transformed her siblings' life as much as her own. One of her sisters is a Dental Surgeon, a brother is a mechanical engineer, and all others are pursuing education for a bright future.

Having had primary education at her village school and high school education at Government Girls' High School, Madhupur, Cuttack, Tulasi joined +2 Science stream at KISS. Under the sponsorship of KISS she passed B.Sc. and M.Sc. in Nursing from KIIT D-U. She obtained her clinical experience as Nursing Officer at KIMS and also served at KIMS as a tutor. Now she is at AIMS, Hyderabad.

She tells us her success story:

In childhood, I had a dream that I would be a doctor in future. But my family background did not allow me to fulfill this dream because my father had no resources, and we had no idea as to how to go about making the dream come true. While I was in high school, my Head Mistress and her husband handed me a paper cutting inviting application for admission at KISS, and urged me to apply for enrolment there. I did and luckily got into KISS. What I am now, KISS has shaped me; where I am, KISS has placed me there. Were it not for KISS and the Founder Sir, I would have been just nobody living nowhere. I would not have had any success story to write.

I missed home initially, no doubt, but the dream of becoming someone in life and doing something good for my family floated before my eyes. Once I got on with the teachers, staff and class-mates, I ceased to be home-sick. KISS was a home away from home.

Even now I regard KISS as my second home; even now I miss KISS as intensely as I had missed my home at the very beginning. I fondly recall all the curricular and extra-curricular activities in which we were engaged at KISS.

My educational background of Odia medium was a major challenge I faced while doing +2 Science. But I had finest teachers at KISS who helped me meet this challenge. The hard work of teachers on a time scale of 24X7 and personal care as though they were personal tutors were great help. With a sense of determination and strong will power I overcame challenges. Achyuta Sir, our beloved Founder, was and still is a constant source of inspiration. I felt recharged and energized every time we students met him.

KISS gave me some good friends who were available for me at every moment I needed them for help and support.

My words fail me to describe how wonderfully supportive they were to me. Initially, I had a social phobia but now I am able to conduct myself very well in any kind of social situation. I told my students that our India, a developing country, has cases of high infant mortality, iniquitous sex ratio, and low literacy rate. These problems can be solved through education. If today literacy rate of the tribal people has improved, it has been made possible by KISS. I feel proud to say this. In many ST families one would find a banker, a teacher or a manager. All this is possible only because of KISS.

My father is no more, so I took full responsibility of the education and health of my family members. I was waiting for a good job, which became feasible to some extent. Now I can look after my family as well as my community. When I go home and meet the people of my community, I encourage them to be engaged in social development by way of teaching the village kids. I myself guide students about their career options. I also conduct health programmes for the adolescent girls, pregnant women and young children and teach them how to take care of their health and hygiene.

As a brand ambassador of KISS I have the aim to guide the meritorious 12th standard Science girl students to go for higher education in nursing, and I will sponsor some of them for higher studies. My message to the KISS students is: Do hard work, with strong determination. Seek help from all the dynamic people at KISS to realize your dreams. Do keep in mind where you came from and what you are now. Be original and never forget your family and community. Never neglect your poor parents, siblings and the society. Bear a positive attitude to turn impossibilities into possibilities.



This is the story of Menaka Ekka, one of the many indigenous children who got a foothold in life with the help of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), Bhubaneswar. She joined KISS in 11th standard after going through a series of tragedies in her life. She is now a part of Sundergarh Collector's media representative team. Her story, shared below in her own words, is a saga of the numerous hardships she has endured:

My father, who was a mason by profession, stayed on small rented premises with me and two of my brothers. I lost my mother early in life and used to cook for the family since my very childhood. Experience taught me how to face difficult situations with composure. Since childhood, I was very interested in studies. But my father used to turn down my request. I got a little scope when my younger brother was sent to an Anganwadi. Later, my elder brother was admitted to an orphanage. When somebody in the family would fall sick, the father did not go to work. On those days, we would go hungry. Our father got us admitted to a government school.

My father passed away soon after. He was run over by a truck. It took us a while to overcome the sorrow. I studied in the village school till Class II. Our trauma did not end here. I was deprived of good food and new dress on festive occasions. I was pushed to the brink and tried to commit suicide, being unable to tolerate abuse. Luckily, I survived. Those years of my life were terrible for me. But it was a blessing in disguise. I learned all types of household work like sweeping, cleaning, laundry, fetching drinking water and cooking. I tolerated everything to keep my passion for studying alive.

After Class VII, my brother got me admitted to St. Mary's Girls' High School at Sundergarh. I used to stay in the hostel and paid the hostel fees from my stipend. In my life, I never knew what is mother's love and affection. But I knew that one can never repay a mother's debt. I grew up without any love and affection. Somehow I passed Class X in the first division. After Class X, my brother got me admitted to KISS. I tried to support him financially by paying his school and hostel fees. Incidentally, my younger brother fled from the hostel. Nobody tried to trace him. Meanwhile, I completed Plus Two first year. I hoped to become a physician by studying science. I But I was offered the commerce stream. Initially, I struggled with the subject. But with time, I settled down to study.

With the mentoring of my teachers at KISS, I tried to forget my sorrows. KISS helped me mould my personality. I found love and affection in the caring words of my teachers. KISS taught me to face life with courage and fortitude. I started a new chapter in my life. My joy knew no bounds when my younger brother who had run away from the hostel returned after three years. In spite of the numerous trials and tribulations, Lord has been kind. KISS has provided me with the much-needed succor to sustain in life.

The enabling environment at KISS taught me to manage difficult situations with courage. Whatever may be the crisis; I always try to remain happy and contended. I am very much thankful to KISS and feel indebted to the father-like figure of Samanta. I continue to pray for the growth of the Institution, I also pray for the well-being of Samanta who has played the stellar role of a good Samaritan and angel in the lives of poor children like us.

# REPLICATING THE KISS MODEL

Dr. Samanta's relentless efforts today have provided a platform to replicate this model of education for deprived children across the country and the world. However, due to paucity of funds from only a single source, it has become a humongous task to realize the vision of one individual and dreams of millions of deprived children.

With this in mind, KISS has started approaching organisations and like-minded individuals to come forward and make this a reality across the state of Odisha, other states of India and across the world. This model has been whole heartedly accepted by Policymakers, Individuals, Corporates and Governments alike. This has led to signings of a few agreements and Memorandum of Understanding between KISS and the organizations to set up KISS model schools.

KISS began its satellite centers in 2013 in the tribal and backward districts of the state, with the vision to replicate the school in smaller variants. This also meant getting forward and approaching organizations to financially accomplish the goal. KISS has set up 20 Offices also known as Satellite centers in these districts with a District coordinator manning the offices to liaison with Government organizations and other local bodies. KISS has also acquired land for the new schools in some of these districts. Some Organizations have already pledged their support and signed MoU's to start schools in these districts. Other Institutes, Governments and Organizations have signed MoU's to begin schools in other states and in their own countries.

# Life Skills Education for Adolescents in Special Schools of Odisha – Project Samarthya

Kalinga Institute of Social Science (KISS) has longstanding experience in implementing the LSE programme in partnership with UNFPA since 2009 and has in-house resources and the capacity of managing programmes towards addressing the needs of children from vulnerable and marginalised communities. Since the LSE programme for children with a disability requires intensive effort for developing resources and communication materials for different types of disabilities (blind, deaf and dumb and physically/mentally challenged), past experience of KISS has been identified as an asset to rollout the project. Under this intervention, the need and importance of Life Skills education will be advocated and the capacities of stakeholders particularly the teachers and school management teams of the special schools will be built. The programme proposes to cover 8700 children with three major categories of disabilities, blind, deaf and dumb and physically and mentally challenged enrolled in 157 special schools across the state.

### Mission Uday - Creating Change makers in Indigenous Communities

This is a joint initiative by REC Foundation of Rural Electrification Corporation Limited (REC), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), the Government of Odisha and the Managing Committee of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences. This initiative is a multistakeholder project envisioned to address the challenges faced by young people from vulnerable indigenous communities of Odisha and seeks to position youth at the centre of development initiatives of the state. This project endeavours to create change agents in the community and build young leaders who would engage in social development processes and influence their peers for the betterment of their communities.

### Life Skills Education based Adolescent Reproductive & Sexual Health

KISS in collaboration with UNFPA started LSE-ARSH initiative with an aim to empower adolescents with correct and age-appropriate information on their safer and informed growing up process as well as initiating measures for institutionalising the intervention for its term sustainability within KISS. The key activities of the project were as follows: -

- Life Skills sessions to students (Class VI to IX) peer education
- Community outreach part of school curriculum
- Counselling, health check-ups and free sanitary napkins
- Promoting research on ARSH
- Undertaking outreach activities on LSE-SRH issues in villages

# Strengthening DRM capacity under Covid 19 Pandemic in Cyclone/Flood Prone Area

In collaboration with Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), the project aims at better integration of varied aspects of biological hazards into existing planning and decision-making mechanisms for Disaster Risk Management (DRM) at the local level in the state of Odisha. The project envisages supporting such integration with enhanced preparedness and capacity of local government and local communities for playing critical roles and functions leading to better management of complex risks of natural and biological hazards.

# Engage and train indigenous youth volunteers & Civil Society Organisations in five districts of Odisha to create awareness on Covid 19 with support from US Consulate, Hyderabad.

The COVID-19 pandemic has also led to people dealing with myriad emotions all at the same time – there is anxiety, there is fear, there is apprehension, there is grief, there is confusion, there is chaos, there is anger and there is hope – that we will 'build back better' - especially cater to the concerns of those at the margin'. In spite of the lockdowns and social distancing measures being adopted, there is a surge in the number of cases and fatalities an upward trend. It is also being said that India is going in a geometric linear way and there will be a peak in the number of cases and fatalities in the coming few months. In such circumstances, it is thereby important that people' at the margins' who do not have access to proper information are made aware of the situation and simultaneously, their capacities built towards resilience and recovery. The project will aim to reach out to the most vulnerable and marginalized in these areas with all relevant and important information about the pandemic and the steps being undertaken by the Government to address the issue and move a step ahead towards embracing the goal of SDGs i.e., 'Leaving no one Behind'. It also aims to use the medium of mass media and other online social networking sites to support the communities and community-led organizations in building their capacities towards building resilience and onwards towards the path of resilience.

# Promoting skill and Entrepreneurship with technology-enabled blended skilling model for indigenous youth

In today's scenario, technology plays a vital role in all aspects of life. When it comes to learning, it makes it easier for the students to understand and acquire knowledge in a better way. For the all-around growth of students and to make them more competent in the challenging scenario, skill development training was provided to the students. They take part in different vocational trades such as tailoring, applique, Arts & crafts, coir, chemical production, handicraft etc. Keeping these things in mind and providing handhold support to the students, and entrepreneurial knowledge, KISS has initiated a Centre for Excellence on Skill and Entrepreneurship in partnership with UNDP. The program aims at building vocational skills in specialized areas for marketable skills enabling gainful engagement in the future careers of the student trainees. ICT-based modules are incorporated into the counselling and training process. The trainees are receiving additional benefits and stipend for attending the program. The experience so far has been very encouraging as the trainees are taking a keen interest and actively participating in the program mastering new skills with joy. KISS has made necessary arrangements allowing flexibility and adjustment of training time in reference to regular classes to avoid clashes and inconvenience. KISS is committed to scaling up the program building on the learning and good practices ensuring its success.

### **Technology-driven smart classrooms**

Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences is proud to offer its students smart classrooms that have been enabled with support from Oracle, giving students access to quick and smart-learning technology, with more interactive, globally connected classes. These allow the indigenous students to see audio-visual clips and benefit from technology-driven interactive teaching methods. Students are also provided with access to books via well-stocked libraries on its campuses. These approaches are vital in ensuring that students can readily access quality education while improving their learning outcomes.

### Mother Tongue-based Multilingual Education Initiative (MTB-MLE)

MTB-MLE is a well-established strategy to address language gaps in early learning. The MTB-MLE programme is sustained within the formal education system at Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences, the pioneering Centre of Excellence on mother tongue-based early childhood education in the state of Odisha. Through Mother Tongue Based MultiLingual Education, the organisation has been filling up the gap in the learning process of indigenous students. Children at the early learning stage are facilitated education through the (MTB-MLE) approach by introducing Transition Curriculum - an innovative pedagogic initiative, teaching and learning tools in 10 indigenous dialects.

### Initiative on Entrepreneurship Skill Development Programme for Indigenous Forest Produce Gatherers

Indigenous communities' livelihood is related to forest produce. To strengthen the supply chain and marketing mechanism, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences started the Entrepreneurship Skill Development Programme in collaboration with TRIFED, Government of India with a focus on building the capacity of indigenous forest produce gatherers. This programme was started to bring more financial power and self-sufficiency to the tribes of India by involving them in all stages of NTFP-based enterprises. It aims to build the capacity of tribes and help them to become successful entrepreneurs under Van Dhan Mission.

### TIGR2ESS (Transforming India's Green Revolution by Research and Empowerment for Sustainable Food Supplies)

TIGR2ESS is a multi-stakeholder project that aims to develop and strengthen alliances across a carefully selected network of UK and Indian experts, to build a collaborative, long-term research partnership in sustainable agriculture that will set India on the path to a second Green Revolution. This project is funded by the Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF), UK and has been awarded to the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) by Cambridge University, UK as one of its partners in India. The time period of the project is from 2018 through 2021. Under the project, KISS is involved in research activities on various aspects related to indigenous food and nutrition security and livelihood in the Koraput and Kandhamal districts of Odisha. It is involved in the flagship project FP6 - Impacting Wellbeing in Rural and Urban Communities (FP6a Education Food, Nutrition and Empowerment (EFNE) and FP6b - Education, Empowerment and Entrepreneurship leading to improved Human Nutrition).

# Project CHIRAG (Creative Hub for Innovation & Reciprocal Research & Action for Gender Equality)

CHIRAG is a Global Research Translation award (GRTA) project, funded by UK Research Innovations (UKRI) on Sustainable Food Systems. Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) is collaborating with the University of East Anglia, UK, along with other Indian Partners PRADAN and Gram Vaani. In Odisha, the project is being implemented by KISS in Koraput and Kandhamal districts and in the Jamui district of Bihar by PRADAN and Gramvaani. The project aims to build a proof of concept to address food & nutrition security along with gender equality in India, a problem faced by a vast majority of women and children, especially from rural and indigenous communities.

### **Work with Migrant Communities**

During the Covid-19 pandemic, care has been taken for both migrant workers and underserved indigenous communities who are our stakeholders at KISS. KISS facilitated smooth in-migration, out-migration and ancillary support during this crisis. KISS has also built the capacity of rural youths in various aspects such as livelihood, safe migration, and government entitlements. KISS also conducts sensitisation programs at the community level to aware dropout youths who are vulnerable to migration to participate in skill development programmes

### **Scoping Study on Impact of COVID 19 on Migrant Labourers**

To evaluate the severe impact of the Covid-19 pandemic-induced lockdown situation on the lives of migrant workers, KISS in collaboration with UNDP conducted a socio-economic impact assessment. This socio-economic impact assessment of Covid-19 on migrant workers also captured information with a special emphasis on female migrant workers. This study was carried out with 1500 migrant households covering 5 migration-prone districts Malkangiri, Rayagada, Koraput, Bolangir and Kandhamal.

### **Industry-Academia Collaboration for Skill Development**

KISS partnered with Bosch for the Industry-Academia Collaboration for Skill Development initiative. Under this collaboration, an Industry-Academia Collaboration Centre was established on its premises. The aim of the initiative was to meet the challenge of eliminating unemployment by reaching out to youth in need of skill development and making them employable. Both organisations have agreed to work on five domains as follows: -

- Skill Development of youth
- MSME Capacity Building
- Trainers' Capacity Building
- Developing Industry-ready Social Service Professional
- Capacity Building of the Non-profit Sector (NGOs)

The initiative has successfully completed the capacity building of subject matter experts in the above five domains. Under the Skill Development of Youth Domain Skill Entrepreneurship program was initiated for creating opportunities for youths to learn and join the skill ecosystem of the country.

### **English Access Micro Scholarship Program**

The English Access Micro scholarship Program (Access Program) is an exciting initiative of the U.S. Department of State. This highly effective training program is designed to provide a significant English-language learning experience to bright non-elite 13 years to 20 years for the present program. It also has the goal of improving students' appreciation of U.S. culture and values, encouraging critical thinking and open-mindedness, and improving performance in regular school classes. In KISS, the program provides a foundation of English language skills to talented indigenous students.

#### Nua Maa

The Nua Maa project was a community media prototype on Infant and Young Child Nutrition (IYCN) and Wanted And Sanitation (WASH) being piloted by KISS in two blocks of Rayagada district with funding support from APPI and implementation support by SAKHA, a CBO of the transgender network. KISS is providing technical support and knowledge management to the program, which is the first of its kind to engage in the mainstream activity of behavioural change communication in the areas of health and nutrition. These fields pose big challenges for the state, country and the world as a whole. Through 'Nua Maa', Transgender women are trained to perform plays on key messages like early registration of pregnancy, IFA and calcium consumption, exclusive breastfeeding, complementary feeding and washing at the community followed by home visits to pregnant and lactating mothers to help transmit knowledge into practice. The programme is currently in its first phase of training, featuring performances on early registration and IFA consumption.

### Kalinga Fellowship

Instrumental in establishing the Kalinga Fellowship in joint partnership with the Bridge Institute, KISS, Ashoka Foundation, FXB India, Prajwala, UN WOMEN and the US Consulate Hyderabad. The fellowship, which has successfully run for 3 years was envisioned as a 10-year programme bringing together the highest levels of government, business and society to advance #SDG5 – Gender Equality – globally. The programme started in the State of Odisha in 2017 to address the issue of sexual harassment in the workplace and in the State of Telangana in 2018, the focus was on gender-based violence and allows leaders from Government, Business and Civil Society to jointly seize opportunities to collaborate, coordinate and collectively act for the UN's vision of #GenerationEquality - to create an impact that will stop sexual exploitation and create a systemic response/environment of zero tolerance towards any kind of sexual abuse/exploitation.

### TCS Free Employability Training

KISS has been facilitating a Free Employability Training Programme by Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) at its campus as well as at a district level for the past five years. Free Employability Training comes under Affirmative Action program of TCS, which aims at providing 100 hours of Free Employability Training to final year undergraduates from SC/ST/BPL/Minorities communities. These training are provided to 4th, 5th and 6th Semester graduate students of KISS. The programme features 40 Hours internal training, followed by 100 Hours by TCS. These 40 Hours are coordinated by TCS, Bhubaneswar office while the 100 Hours of training are coordinated by TCS, Kolkata office in consultation with KISS. In 2020, after the successful completion of the last batch of TCS' Free Employability Training programme, 11 students were selected for jobs at TCS, pending the completion of their degrees.

### **Compassionate Integrity Training**

'Compassionate Integrity Training' is being jointly conducted by UNESCO MGIEP & Life University to KIIT & KISS Universities in 2019, as part of initiatives to bring concepts of compassionate living to higher education spaces in India. Compassionate Integrity Training was first developed under the auspices of the Centre for Compassion, Integrity and Secular Ethics (CCISE) at Life University. It is a multi-part training program that cultivates basic human values as skills for the purpose of increasing individual, social and environmental flourishing. By covering a range of skills from self-regulation and self-compassion to compassion for others and engagement with complex systems, CIT focuses on and builds towards compassionate integrity. This is a pilot programme, introduced by UNESCO MGIEP, Indian higher educational institutes for the first time, under the banner of their pan-India 'Kindness Campaign. KIIT/KISS and O. P. Jindal University are the first Indian university partners of this revolutionary training.

### The Alliance of Universities to Reinforce teacher training curricula to Outcast Radicalism and promote equality in Asian societies (AURORA)

The AURORA project is a three-year programme, curated to focus on the issues of inclusion, diversity and integration of socio-economically disadvantaged participants. It is funded by the Erasmus + Programme of the European Union. It strives to create a programme for Curricula Reform in India and Nepal that will promote inclusive education through teacher training programmes at BA and MA levels by developing new courses in educational programmes, faculty and teacher workshops, student leadership training and student activities, democratic values and combat radicalism to be applied from early stages in the school. This project aims at training teachers from India and Nepal.

### **Children Development Resource Centre**

UNICEF in association with KISS has established a Children Development Resource Centre (CDRC) as part of the larger UNICEF-KIIT University joint initiative for the Centre for Children Studies (CCS). The goal is to promote evidence–based policy-making by building a knowledgebase through action research and other development programmes on children's issues focusing on the state of Odisha. A resource centre was established at KISS for students and research scholars.

### **Groundwater for Emergency Situations (GWES)**

KISS is implementing a project on Groundwater for Emergency Situations (GWES), as a part of the activities of the International Hydrological Programme (IHP) of UNESCO.

### **NIRD Research Project**

We have also been able to bag a research project from NIRD (Hyderabad) for an amount of 11,60,000 (Eleven Lakh Sixty Thousand). This is a study of Gram Panchayats of Odisha and Chattisgarh.

### **Student Sponsorship Program with NALCO**

The sponsorship program that was initiated in 2012 with 214 children is being ramped up. They have been sponsoring all students from their Damanjodi peripheral region. Approximately an amount of 50-70 Lakh is being sponsored every year under this project Partner: NALCO Foundation

### Free Education with Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP)

In collaboration with Rourkela Steel Plant, KISS is facilitating the education of tribal children from RSP's vicinity. This is the initial stage of the collaboration and negotiations are on for a proposed school for the underprivileged which is on the anvil.

### **Student Sponsorship with ESSEL Mining**

Essel Mining has sponsored the education of several students from their peripheral mining areas.

### **Youth Leadership Program**

Youth Leadership Program was initiated by US Consulate Hyderabad. The objective of the program is to help students meet the challenges of adulthood and leadership success. Sponsored by US Consulate Hyderabad and conducted by Toastmasters International and its local clubs, the program has helped young students build their communication and leadership skills so that they may become tomorrow's leaders in business, industry and the community.

### **Study Abroad with AFS**

Under this project with AFS Intercultural Project we are initiating for a few students to study abroad for two semesters or 1 years of Higher Education (+2 Level) in the United States.

### **Carp Culture and Broodstock Management**

The National Fishery Development Board (NFDB) sponsored training programme sought to give training for KISS students on Carp Culture and Broodstock management 2017-18. In total 13 batches of training programmes were undertaken.

### AIESEC

Under the project with AIESEC, various international students have the opportunity to come and volunteer and do internships with KISS. We have received more than 20 international students to date under this initiative.

### **Give India**

KISS is accredited with Give India. The main aim of Give India is to promote an effective and efficient giving culture that provides greater opportunities to the poor in India. It is a vibrant 'philanthropy marketplace' to ensure that the most effective and efficient non-profits get access to resources. After thorough scrutiny, KISS has been accredited with Give India.

#### **Tata Steel**

KISS and Tata Steel have agreed to strengthen the relationship between the industry and the institutions by developing collaboration in various academic, research, training and staff development activities. The two organizations have facilitated the education of the children of the displaced families at KISS and work for the upliftment of the marginalized vulnerable sections of the population. Other initiatives include an upcoming Tata Library at KISS.

### **National Mineral Development Corporation (NMDC)**

National Mineral Development Corporation (NMDC) in collaboration with KISS is setting up a fully free residential school for tribal children at Kanker in the state of Chhattisgarh. The work for the NMDC-KISS residential school is in progress. The school will follow the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) curriculum with a strength of 4000 tribal students.

### **Center of American Studies**

A Center of American Studies has been set up in KISS by US Embassy. It is the 41st such centre in the country and the 1st in the State of Odisha. It offers the students opportunity to learn more about the United States – its history, literature, politics, art and culture.

### **Max India Foundation**

KISS has been immunizing students in the age group of 5 – 7 years with MMR and Hepatitis vaccination every year in partnership with Max India Foundation. The immunization camps are held twice a month with around 400 children vaccinated each month.

### **TATA Sponge Iron Limited**

TATA Sponge Iron Limited has awarded KISS a project on baseline study for sustainable CSR interventions in and around TATA Sponge areas, Keonjhar, Odisha.

### **Zigitza Health Care Services**

KISS was the training partner of the NRHM Programme, (108 Ambulance training) working in collaboration with Ziqitza Health Care Services. The institute is involved in Ambulance service training.

### **EdCIL**

EdCIL has funded the provision of books for secondary students and we are currently also discussing possibilities of a few other CSR donations.

### **GKL** and other small projects

With the help of Hanseo University we have initiated small project through the South Korean Government support and Hanseo University support wherein we have undertaken an electrical training project under the flagship of GKL project. Similarly, they have donated other products such as Hospital equipment, desktops, printers, Refrigerators, etc to KISS.

### **FXB India Suraksha**

Both KISS and FXB are working for the common cause of promoting education for less privileged children of India. This association has made KISS work with large organizations working on similar grounds and concerns.

### **Banchte Shekha**

Banchte Shekha is a foundation in Bangladesh with a global cause of empowering poor rural women and children through various programs. Both KISS and Banchte Shekha are working for the common cause of promoting education for less privileged children of Bangladesh and India.

### C.E.S.I.E. (European Centre of Studies and Initiatives), Italy

C.E.S.I.E. is a volunteering programme sponsored by the Italian Government for a period of one year. Italian students will have the chance to work in various programmes and projects running at KISS.

### **MoU with Intel Technology**

In collaboration with Intel Technology KISS embarked upon computer literacy and training for its teachers and students. Intel technology provided the expertise and master trainers for the said programme.

### **Child & Youth Finance International**

KISS has collaborated with Child & Youth Finance International to help strengthen the skills of the students studying in the institute. The cooperation will also target the children and youth in the 20 districts of Odisha where KISS has its operations

### KISS Association with Tibetan Government in Exile

KISS in association with Pure Water Project Foundation, a New York-based Foundation, is implementing a project to provide clean water to villages in Odisha and in India. Presently the project is based in Chandragiri, a Tibetan settlement in Odisha.

### Hamara Bachpan Campaign

Humara Bachpan' is a national campaign on living conditions for young children in urban poverty. KIIT & KISS will bring visibility of the campaign throughout the nation targeting specifically the national media to reach the target audience and linking the campaign with policymakers at the national level.

### **Bridges of Sports**

With 'Bridges of Sports Foundation' we have initiated a program to train athletes to become coaches. So far four students of ISS are enrolled in this program and have undergone training and are now actively coaching at KISS with a monthly stipend also being given to them.

### Crossover

Crossover Basketball and Scholars Academy is an educational non-profit organization that pairs basketball with an academic focus in a manner that will ensure that students become lifelong learners, and are able to see the doors of education open. Crossover is interested to open a school in Tamil Nadu in association with KISS and also apply their methodology of basketball in forging creativity, drive and cooperation.

### **KISS Delhi School**

KISS has collaborated with Delhi Government and started KISS branch in Delhi for socially and economically backward communities, including minorities.

### **Center for Canadian Studies**

In collaboration with Canadian Embassy, KISS has started Center for Canadian Studies. It was inaugurated by the Canadian High Commissioner to India.

### **National Slum Dwellers Federation**

In association with Mr. Jockin Arputham, Magsaysay award winner, KISS will carry out development work in the slums of Odisha and India.

### **British Council**

KISS in association with the British High Commission of India has been working in various academic fields for the past four years. KIIT conducted the first-ever Law Week in the School of Law in collaboration with the British High Commission.

### **Russian Consulate**

KIIT University and KISS in collaboration with Russian Consulate, Kolkata has set up a Center for Russian Studies.

### **Tata Consultancy Services (TCS)**

MoU has been signed between KISS and TCS to provide training services to students for improving English communication, basic computer skills and corporate etiquette. Under this project, almost 70 students have already been placed with TCS BPO till now.

### **Air Liquide Foundation**

KISS in collaboration with Air Liquid Foundation has been promoting the skill of food processing and preservation amongst the tribal children. Air Liquide Foundation provided financial support for the procurement of all required materials for providing training to the students and teachers involved in this programme.

### **Collaboration with British Council**

British Council in partnership with Diageo has launched the Young Women Social Entrepreneurship Development Programme which held 4 batches of training programmes at KISS. 100 women and girls were trained in a wide range of social entrepreneurship subjects with the aim to empower them to start their own social enterprises.

### Collaboration with the Commissionerate of Police

KISS embarked on a programme to train police personnel on sensitization and behavioural practices. The research was undertaken on the daily workings of the police system and feedback was given to the Commissionerate of Police, Bhubaneswar and Cuttack.

### **Ashoka Youth Venture**

We have been able to collaborate with Ashoka Foundation and the result has been 4 Youth identified and trained as Youth Venturers. Under the guidance of Ashoka. They are spearheading positive entrepreneurship skills for their communities.

### **KISS Novartis & Bridge Partnership**

An initiative is underway for KISS to be clients to strategic issue solving pertaining to the institute and community through this project wherein 40 officials from Novartis Switzerland would embark on a training cum problem-resolving partnership for 4 days in 2019.

### **Google Ads**

Google Ads worth \$10000 are granted to KISS annually under Google's Non-Profit programme.

### **Tata Strive**

TATA Strive signed MOU with KISS to impart skills to 2900 KISS students during the year 2017, as part of their Corporate Social Responsibility on 2nd August 2017 at KISS.

### **Yunus Centre**

Yunus Social Business Centre was established at KISS in association with Mohammed Yunus's Yunus Centre.

# FINANCIAL REPORT 2022

Financial Statements from 2021 to 2022

Income & Expenditure for the year

### Sources of Income at KISS

The total receipts by way of donations & grants from various sources are **Rs. 136.79 crores** as detailed below:

- As per the memorandum of KIIT Society, minimum 5% of the total turnover of KIIT is provided to KISS as donation. This financial year KIIT has donated Rs. 84.79 crores towards KISS' recurring expenses.
- As per service rules all staff members of KIIT Group & KISS contribute 3% of their salary to KISS which amounted to Rs. 11.39 crores.
- The donations from civil society and well-wishers contribute benevolently for this noble cause amounting to Rs. 4.41 crores.
- Donations received from different organisations, corporate houses like Give India amounting to Rs. 9.08 cores (approx.).
- Further, Grants & others received from various organisations for projects Rs.
   24.31 crores.
- Bank Interest and other miscellaneous receipts are Rs. 2.81 crores.

Total recurring expenditure for the year 2019-20 is Rs. 93.28 crores

Total 5% seats in professional education programs of KIIT University are reserved for meritorious students from KISS. Several meritorious students from KISS are studying free of cost in KIIT Group of Institutions in technical and professional courses, such as Bachelor of Medicine & Surgery (MBBS), Dental Sciences & Surgery, Nursing, Engineering, Masters in Computer Application (MCA), Bachelor / Masters in Law, Management (MBA), Diploma in Engineering, etc. This involves a financial outlay of Rs. 20 crores (approx).

KIIT University also provides support services by way of visiting faculty, transpiration, maintenance for electricity / water supply system, medical assistance, security, etc. and these costs will add up to further Rs. 10.00 crores

Thus the Overall Recurring expenses will be in the range of Rs. 123.28 crores.

In addition the Non- recurring expenses during the year are Rs. 71.02 crores that were mostly funded by donations from KIIT.
